DAILY UPDATE 1 :IMPORTANT DAY



National Pollution Control Day : 02 December :-

Every year on December 2, National Pollution Control Day is observed to remember those who died in the 1984 Bhopal Gas Tragedy. It is also a day set aside to raise awareness about the dangers of air pollution. The Bhopal Gas Tragedy is regarded as one of the worst industrial pollution disasters in history. Many people died due to the poisonous gas Methyl Isocyanate, also known as MIC. Environmental pollution, directly and indirectly, affects the quality of life more than one can imagine. All this is mainly caused by human activities which harm the environment in more than one way.

UP Government To Build Ramayana, Mahabharata, Buddhist Circuits:-

The Uttar Pradesh Cabinet recently approved the New Tourism Policy in order to foster the state's religious potential and to establish the state as the hub of religious and spiritual tourism in the country. According to the policy, the state will create separate religious circuits. While discussing the new tourism policy and the development of new areas, State Cabinet Minister AK Sharma stated that Ayodhya, Chitrakoot, Bithoor, and other Ramayana-related sites will be included in the Ramayana circuit.

Jaguar Land Rover Chief Executive Officer Thierry Bolloré Resigns:-

Thierry Bolloré, Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Jaguar Land Rover, has resigned from the company for personal reasons, according to Tata Motors. Jaguar is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Tata Motors. Bolloré stepped down for personal reasons. In September 2020, he was named CEO of Jaguar. He thanked the entire team for their hard work and dedication, and wished the organisation all the best in the future. Adrian Mardell has been named interim CEO. Adrian has worked for Jaguar Land Rover for 32 years and has served on the Executive Board for three years.

Sandhya Devanathan Appointed As Meta's New India Head:-

After several high-profile departures in its offices around the world, Facebook's parent company Meta has appointed Sandhya Devanathan as the new head of its India business. Ms. Devanathan is a global business leader with 22 years of experience in banking, payments, and technology. She joined Meta in 2016 and helped build out the Singapore and Vietnam businesses and teams, as well as the tech giant's Southeast Asian e-commerce initiatives. Ms. Devanathan will report to Dan Neary, Vice President of Meta Asia-Pacific, in her new position.

President Sh. Murmu Appoints Dr CV Ananda Bose As Governor Of West Bengal:-

West Bengal Governor Dr CV Ananda Bose has been appointed by President Droupadi Murmu. The position of Governor of West Bengal became vacant after the previous governor, Jagdeep Dhankhar, was elected Vice President of India on August 11. Bose, 71, is a 1977-batch (retired) Kerala cadre Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer who most recently worked as an administrator at the National Museum in Kolkata before retiring in 2011. He was also the Secretary to the Government of India.

DAILY UPDATE 6 : MISCELLANEOUS



Maximum Tenure Of CEO And MD Of Public Sector Banks Increased To 10 Years:-

The government has decided to extend the tenure of the Managing Director and other full-time directors of public sector banks. The appointment can now be made for up to 5 years and then extended for the same number of years. The current rules call for appointments to last three years or until the employee reaches the age of 60, whichever comes first. Though no reason has been given for the extended tenure, it is believed to have been done to ensure consistency and continuity in the operation of Public Sector Banks.

DAILY UPDATE 7 : INTERNATIONAL



IPC Suspends Russian, Belarusian Committees With Immediate Effect:-

The International Paralympic Committee (IPC) voted to suspend Russia and Belarus' National Paralympic Committees (NPCs) with immediate effect. Athletes from both countries were previously barred from competing in the March 2022 Winter Paralympics in Beijing due to Russia's invasion of Ukraine, for which Belarus served as a staging area. Russia's suspension was approved by the IPC's extraordinary General Assembly in Berlin by a vote of 64 to 39, with 16 abstentions. Belarus' NPC was suspended by a vote of 54-45, with 18 abstentions.

Former Bureaucrat Arun Goel Appointed As Election Commissioner:-

Arun Goel, a retired bureaucrat, has been appointed as an Election Commissioner ahead of Gujarat's critical assembly election. For nearly six months, the third position in the country's top election body has been vacant. Mr Goel, a Punjab cadre officer from the 1985 batch, will serve on the poll panel alongside Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar and Election Commissioner Anup Chandra Pandey. Former Chief Election Commissioner Sushil Chandra retired in May of this year, leaving Rajiv Kumar in charge.

Veteran Punjabi actress Daljeet Kaur dies at 69 in Ludhiana:-

According to a family member, Daljeet Kaur, a popular performer known for playing memorable roles in many superhit Punjabi films, died in Punjab's Ludhiana. She was 69 years old at the time. She graduated from Delhi's Lady Shri Ram College and began her film career in 1976 with the film 'Daaz.' Kaur had a number of successful films under her belt, including MamlaGarbar Hai, Putt Jattan De, Patola, Ki Banu Duniya Da, and Saida Jogan. She took a break from acting following the tragic death of her husband, Harminder Singh Deol, in a car accident.

India Launched Its First Privately Developed Rocket, The Vikram-S:-

Vikram-S, India's first privately developed rocket, successfully lifted off from the Sriharikota spaceport, marking the private sector's entry into the country's space industry. Skyroot Aerospace, a four-year-old Hyderabad-based startup, developed the rocket, which was launched with assistance from ISRO and IN-SPACe (Indian National Space Promotion and Authorisation Centre).The rocket carried three payloads built by Andhra Pradesh-based N Space Tech India, Chennai-based startup Space Kids and Armenian BazoomQ Space Research Lab.
