53rd IFFI: Chiranjeevi Honoured With Indian Film Personality Of The Year 2022:-

The International Film Festival of India (IFFI) recently awarded Telugu superstar Chiranjeevi the Indian Film Personality of the Year Award at its 53rd edition. The announcement was made at the IFFI opening ceremony by Union Information and Broadcasting Minister Anurag Thakur. The I&B Minister praised the actor, saying he has had an illustrious career spanning nearly four decades. "He is immensely popular in Telegu cinema with incredible performances touching hearts," his post read.

Kassym-Jomart Tokayev Of Kazakhstan Re-Elected As President:-

Kazakh President Kassym-Jomart Tokayev was re-elected with 81.31% of the vote, according to the Central Election Commission, citing preliminary data. Mr. Tokayev won his first election in 2019 with the support of his predecessor, Nursultan Nazarbayev, but the two fell out this year amid violent unrest in the 20-million-strong country, and the recent

election consolidated his power as an independent leader. Several other Central Asian leaders congratulated Mr. Tokayev prior to the preliminary results, prompted by the exit polls.

Kathak Exponent Uma Sharma Received Sumitra Charat Ram Award:-

Uma Sharma, a Kathak exponent, has received the prestigious 'Sumitra Charat Ram Award' in recognition of her contribution to Indian classical music and dance. She received the award from former Governor of Jammu and Kashmir Karan Singh and Sarod player Ustad Amjad Ali Khan at a ceremony hosted by Shriram Bharatiya Kala Kendra (SBKK) at Kamani Auditorium. The prestigious award, established in 2010, honours the contribution of art impresario and SBKK founder Sumitra Charat Ram as a cultural revivalist in post-independence India.

New Zealand Supreme Court Rules Voting Age Of 18 Is Discriminatory In The Country:-

The New Zealand Supreme Court ruled that the minimum voting age of 18 years was discriminatory. According to media reports, the ruling has compelled the New Zealand parliament to consider lowering the minimum age limit. The decision

came in a case filed in 2020 in which an advocacy group requested that the voting age be reduced to 16 years. According to media reports, the country's highest court ruled that the current minimum age limit of 18 is incompatible with the Bill of Rights.

HDFC Bank, Canara Bank Get RBI Approval For Rupee Trade With Russia:-

According to media reports, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has approved the opening of special vostro accounts by two more lenders, HDFC Bank and Canara Bank, in order to facilitate rupee trade with Russia. This opens the door to cross-border trade in Indian currency, particularly between New Delhi and Moscow. The central bank introduced a new system for settling international trades in rupees in July. The mechanism, which allows for the invoicing, payment, and settlement of exports and imports in rupees, is intended to encourage trade.

India And EU Sign Agreement For Cooperation In High-Performance Computing:-

The European Union (EU) and India have signed an agreement on cooperation in high-tech areas such as climate modelling and quantum technologies, building on the Trade and Technology Council established earlier this year. According to the statement, the goal of this agreement was to facilitate collaboration on high performance computing

applications using Indian and European supercomputers in areas such as bio-molecular medicines, Covid-19 therapeutics, mitigating climate change, predicting natural disasters, and quantum computing.

India Take Over Chairmanship Of The Global Partnership On AI From France:-

On November 21, India took over the Chair of the Global Partnership on Artificial Intelligence (GPAI) from France. Rajeev Chandrasekhar, Minister of State for Electronics and Information Technology, represented the country at the GPAI meeting in Tokyo for the symbolic takeover from France. GPAI is a global initiative that promotes responsible, human-centered development and the use of artificial intelligence. India became a founding member of the GPAI in 2020. Artificial intelligence is expected to boost the Indian economy by 967 billion US dollars by 2035.

The Indian Army's South Western Command held an Integrated Fire Power Exercise called "SHATRUNASH" at MFFR in Rajasthan's Thar desert. Karnataka Has Highest Installed Grid-Interactive Renewable Power Capacity In India:-

When the total installed capacity of grid-interactive renewable power in all states of the country was compared, Karnataka came out on top. According to an RBI publication, the state had a total installed capacity of 15,463 megawatts (mw). According to the Reserve Bank of India's(RBI) Handbook of Statistics on Indian States 2021-22, which was the seventh edition of its statistical publication, Tamil Nadu came in second with 15,225 mw, Gujarat came in third with 13,153 mw, and Maharashtra came in fourth with 10,267 mw.

India-Australia FTA Ratified By Australian Parliament:-

As the Australian Parliament has approved the two countries' free trade agreement (FTA), India and Australia will now implement it on a mutually agreed-upon date. Speaking at a function Commerce and industry minister Piyush Goyal said that now the Australian government will take approval from their executive council and the ministry from the Union

Cabinet here. The minister asked the steel industry to take benefit of zero duty in the Australian market and push their exports.
