### **DAILY UPDATE 1 :IMPORTANT DAY**



#### **Dr Ambedkar MahaparinirvanDiwas :06 December:-**

December 6, 2022, marks the death 66th death anniversary of Dr BR Ambedkar, the chief architect of the Indian Constitution. He was the first Law Minister of Independent India, as well as a social reformer, economist, thinker, and politician. Ambedkar, who was born on April 14, 1891, led from the front alongside Jawaharlal Nehru and Gandhi in the upliftment of the poor and backward classes of society. Ambedkar spearheaded the Dalit Buddhist campaign and worked tirelessly for their equal human rights and advancement.

### **DAILY UPDATE 2 :BOOKS**



#### **Reeta Ramamurthy Gupta Reveals New Book On Savitribai Phule:-**

On the 132nd anniversary of Mahatma Jyotirao Phule's death, Harper Collins and Reeta Ramamurthy Gupta announced a new book about friends 'Savitri and Fatima,' who worked tirelessly in the 19th century for the education of women and lower castes. The author stated that we are all familiar with the story of how young Malala was shot by the Taliban. Savitri and Fatima were stoned as they went door to door asking parents to send their girls and those from lower castes

to school in the mid-nineteenth century. In 1848, they founded the first non-British, non-missionary school for girls with Jyotirao Phule.

## DAILY UPDATE 3:STATE



### **Uttarakhand High Court To Be Shifted To Haldwani From Nainital:-**

According to officials familiar with the situation, the Uttarakhand state cabinet has given "in-principle approval" to move the high court from Nainital to Haldwani. They did, however, add that "it is not yet a cabinet decision." They stated that the state government will now investigate technical and other aspects of the HC's relocation. There has long been a demand to relocate the High Court from Nainital due to the tourist rush, lack of space, and difficult geographical location, though a large number of lawyers and locals have been opposed to the move.

## DAILY UPDATE 4 :SUMMITS AND CONFERENCES



### **China Holds First China-Indian Ocean Region Forum Without India:-**

China's expansion into South Asia and the Indian Ocean Region (IOR) continued recently with the organisation of the first high-level China-Indian Ocean Region Forum on Development Cooperation, attended by 19 countries from the region except India. Despite the fact that the event was held quietly alongside many other events in Kunming, including

the 6th China-South Asia expo and the China-Indian Ocean region thinktank forum in a hybrid format, it demonstrated China's ongoing quest for a larger presence and role in the strategically important Indian Ocean.

## DAILY UPDATE 5 :DEFENCE



### India, Australia Training Exercise “Austra Hind 22”:-

According to the Defence Ministry, a bilateral training exercise between the armies of India and Australia began on November 28 in Rajasthan. "Bilateral training exercise—Austra Hind 22— between contingents of the Indian Army and the Australian Army, is scheduled to take place at Mahajan Field Firing Ranges (Rajasthan) from 28 November to 11 December 2022. This is the first exercise in the series of Austra Hind with participation of all arms and services contingent from both armies," the Ministry said in a statement.

## DAILY UPDATE 6 :MISCELLANEOUS



### Egypt’s President Invited As Chief Guest For Republic Day 2023:-

According to an official statement from the Ministry of External Affairs, India has invited Egyptian President Abdel Fattah Al Sisi to be the chief guest on Republic Day 2023. The Egyptian president would be the chief guest at the Republic Day celebrations for the first time. Egypt will also be one of nine guest countries at the G20 summit in 2023, during India's

presidency. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, India has declined to invite any foreign dignitary as the chief guest for the Republic Day celebrations in 2021 and 2022.

## DAILY UPDATE 7 :SUMMITS AND CONFERENCES



### 14th Edition Of Aero India 2023 To Be Held From 13-17 February 2023 In Bengaluru:-

Aero India 2023 will be held from the 13th to the 17th of February 2023 at the Air Force Station in Yelahanka, Bengaluru, according to the Ministry of Defence. Since 1996, the show has been held at Air Force Station Yelahanka. Aero India 2023, Asia's largest airshow, will feature both domestic and international exhibitors. It will also make virtual exhibitions possible. The biennial show is open to both business and general public visitors. The biennial exhibition will last five days. Due to the Covid pandemic, the show was reduced to three days in 2021.

## DAILY UPDATE 8 : STATE



### Tamil Nadu Govt Declared Arittapatti Village In Madurai As A Biodiversity Heritage Site:-

The Tamil Nadu government has declared Arittapatti village near Melur in Madurai district a biodiversity heritage site under Section 37 of the Biological Diversity Act, 2002. The site, which covers an area of 193.21 hectares, is the state's first Biodiversity Heritage Site (BHS) to be notified in the state. The Arittapatti village, according to a statement, is

surrounded by a chain of seven barren granite hillocks that act as a watershed and support nearly 72 lakes, 200 natural spring pools, and three check dams.

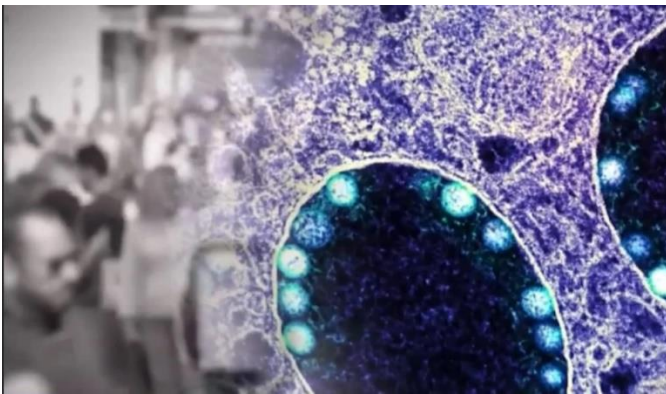
## DAILY UPDATE 9 :AWARDS

### **Monkeypox Disease Name Changed To Mpox By WHO:-**

According to the World Health Organization, "mpox" is now the preferred name for monkeypox. "Both names will be used concurrently for one year while 'monkeypox' is phased out," according to the organisation. According to the organisation, monkeypox was named in 1970, more than a decade after the virus that causes the disease was discovered in captive monkeys. However, monkeypox did not originate in monkeys – its origin is unknown – and the virus can be

found in a variety of other animals. The name was created before the WHO published best practises for disease naming in 2015.
