ARMED FORCES FLAG DAY 7 DECEMBER

Armed Forces Flag Day : 07 December:-

Every year on December 7, India commemorates Armed Forces Flag Day. Its goal is to raise funds for the betterment of the Armed Forces Staff by selling Indian flags, batches, stickers, and other items. On August 28, 1949, a committee was formed under the leadership of India's then-Defense Minister. The committee decided to hold a Flag Day every year on December 7. The funds raised are used to benefit serving and ex-service personnel, as well as to rehabilitate battle casualties.

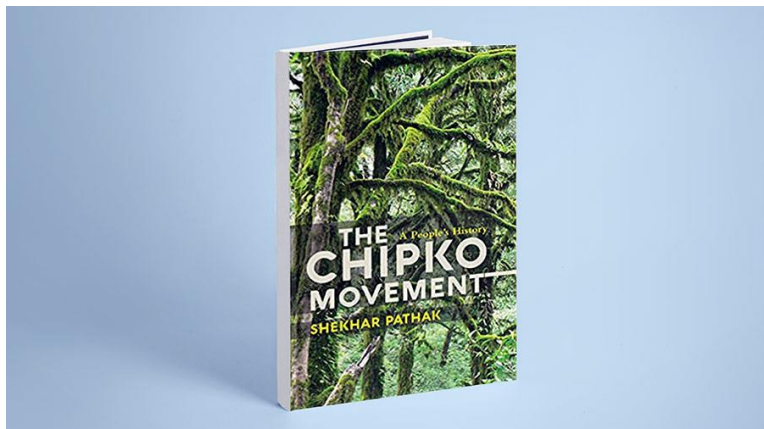


International Civil Aviation Day: 07 December:-

International Civil Aviation Day is observed on December 7 each year to highlight the role of civil aviation in 21st-century transportation and the importance it plays in connecting people and enhancing social and economic development worldwide. Since 2013, the International Civil Aviation Day has been observed to raise global awareness about the contributions of the civil aviation industry and the unique role of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) in

assisting countries in cooperating and realising a global rapid transport network. The theme for International Civil Aviation Day 2022 is, "Advancing Innovation for Global Aviation Development".

Shekhar Pathak's "The Chipko Movement: A People's History" has won the 2022 Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay NIF Book Prize:-

Shekhar Pathak's "The Chipko Movement: A People's History" has won the Rs 15 lakh Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay NIF Book Prize 2022. The jury said: "This is the definitive history of the Chipko movement by a scholar who has practically lived it. It is fitting that a book that tells the story of a movement through the eyes of the local communities, especially women, should be as readable as this one is. Translated from the Hindi by Manisha Chaudhry, Shekhar Pathak's book is a salutary reminder of the transformative power of collective action."

Former President of China Jiang Zemin Passes Away:-

Jiang Zemin, China's former leader who came to power following the Tiananmen Square protests, died in Shanghai at the age of 96. Jiang presided over a period when China opened up on a grand scale and experienced rapid growth. According to a Chinese Communist Party statement, he died from leukaemia and multiple organ failure. Under his

leadership, China built a formidable economy, the Communists tightened their grip on power, and China ascended to the top table of world powers. He oversaw Hong Kong's peaceful handover in 1997 and China's admission to the World Trade Organization in 2001.

First Science Documentary Made In Sanskrit 'Yaanam' Screened At The 53rd IFFI:-

'Yaanam,' a non-feature film, was shown at the 53rd International Film Festival in Goa. It is based on former space chairman Padma Bhushan Dr. K. Radhakrishnan's autobiographical book "My Odyssey: Memoirs of the Man Behind the Mangalyaan Mission." The film 'Yaanam' depicts India's dream project Mars Orbiter Mission (Mangalyaan). It is the first science documentary in the history of world cinema to be made in Sanskrit. It demonstrates the Indian Space Research Organization's (ISRO) capability and expertise.

SEBI Announced Sundararaman Ramamurthy The New MD & CEO Of BSE:-

Sundararaman Ramamurthy has been appointed as the managing director and chief executive officer of the BSE by the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI). Ramamurthy's appointment is contingent on his acceptance of the offer

made to him and the fulfilment of terms and conditions, including approval from BSE shareholders, according to a filing by the stock exchange. With a speed of 6 microseconds, the BSE (formerly Bombay Stock Exchange), established in 1875, is Asia's first and the world's fastest stock exchange.

NITI Aayog Releases Report 'Carbon Capture, Utilisation, and Storage Policy Framework and its Deployment Mechanism in India':-

NITI Aayog published a study report titled 'Carbon Capture, Utilisation, and Storage Policy Framework and its Deployment Mechanism in India'. The report investigates the significance of carbon capture, utilisation, and storage as an emission reduction strategy for achieving deep decarbonization from difficult-to-abate sectors. The report outlines broad-level policy interventions required across various sectors in order for it to be implemented. According to the report, approximately 750 million tonnes of carbon capture per year by 2050 can generate approximately 8-10 million job opportunities.

IFFI 53: Iranian Film 'Nargesi' Wins ICFT-UNESCO Gandhi Medal:-

The ICFT-UNESCO Gandhi Medal was awarded to Iranian film Nargesi by Director Payam Eskandari at the 53rd edition of the International Film Festival of India for a film that best reflects Mahatma Gandhi's ideals of peace, tolerance, and

nonviolence. Eskandari is a young Iranian filmmaker best known for his films 'Nargesi,' 'The Good, the Bad, and the Corny' (2017), and 'Mohey' (2016). He's also been an actor and a writer. This year, nine films from around the world will compete for the ICFT-UNESCO Gandhi Medal.

Indore Plans India's First Retail Municipal Green Bond For Solar Plant:-

Indore intends to issue the country's first local government bond, aimed at individual investors, with the proceeds going toward a solar power project. According to Divyank Singh, chief executive officer of Indore Smart City, who is working with various stakeholders to finalise the offering, Indore Municipal Corp. hopes to raise up to 2.6 billion rupees (\$31.8 million) through a 10-year bond sale next month. The Indore municipal green bond, which is located in the central state of Madhya Pradesh, will also be the country's first municipal green bond designed for retail investors.

Paralympic Medallist Avani Lekhara Receives Para Sports Person Of Year Award:-

Sarkar Talwar, a former Ranji cricketer, was honoured with the Lifetime Achievement of the Year award at the Turf 2022 and India Sports Awards of the FICCI. Talwar, the Director-Sports at Manav Rachna Education Institutions, is also the recipient of the President of India's Dronacharya Lifetime Award. Avani Lekhara, who won two medals at the Tokyo 2020

Paralympics, was named Para Sports Person of the Year, while ShreyKadyan was named Special Sportsperson of the Year, in addition to Talwar.
