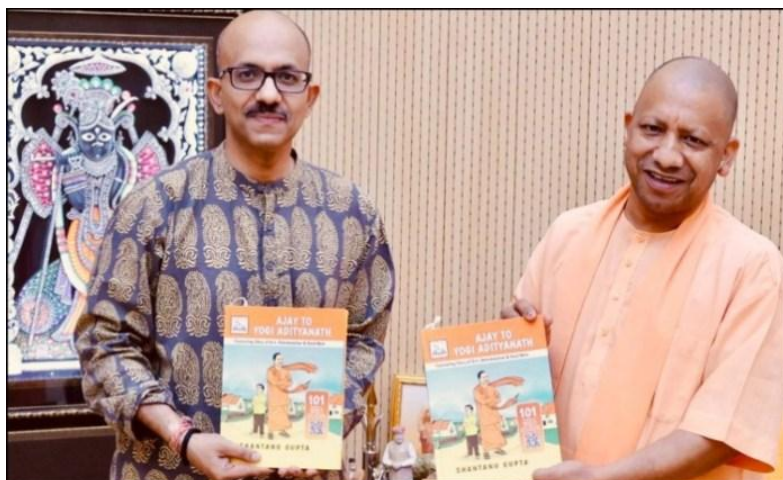
DAILY UPDATE 1 :IMPORTANT DAY

Dennis Francis elected as President of the UN General Assembly:-

Dennis Francis, a citizen of Trinidad and Tobago (TT), created history by becoming the first TT citizen to be elected as the President of the UN General Assembly (UNGA). Francis, who has served in the diplomatic service for over 40 years, was nominated on April 1 and faced no opposition in the election. He will serve as the 78th President of the UNGA. United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) is the United Nation's chief policy-making and representative organ and was created in 1945. It is one of the six principal organs of the United Nations (UN).

Dr Abdulla elected as President of World Meteorological Organization:-

A meteorologist of United Arab Emirates (UAE) Dr Abdulla Al Mandous has been elected as the new President of the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) for a four-year term from 2023 to 2027. The WMO is an authoritative body within the UN system that focuses on weather, climate, hydrological, and related environmental fields. Dr. Abdulla, the official candidate of the UAE secured 95 votes out of 193 member states and territories. This is the first time that a GCC meteorologist and an Arab meteorologist from Asia has been named as the president of WMO.

Nova Kakhovka Dam in Ukraine destroyed :-

Nova Kakhovka Dam in Ukraine has suffered a catastrophic blow, leading to concerns of devastating flooding. Ukraine's military and Nato have accused Russia of blowing up the dam, while Russia has blamed Ukraine. Thousands of people were evacuated from communities in the surrounding areas, as catastrophic floods engulf low-lying areas either side of the river Dnipro. The Kakhovka Hydroelectric Power Plant is in the city of Nova Kakhovka in the Kherson region. The city is currently under Russian occupation.

Kerala Fibre Optical Network launched by P Vijyan:-

Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan on 5 June launched the ambitious Kerala Fibre Optical Network (KFON), which is envisaged to provide high-speed internet connectivity for all households in the state. Basically, KFON will act as an infrastructure provider. It is an optical fibre cable network of 30,000 kms, with 375 Points-of-Presence across Kerala. The KFON infrastructure will be shared with all service providers, including cable operators. While KFON will do the cable work for government offices, individual beneficiaries will have to depend on private, local internet service providers.

Procurement ceilings of 40 percent for tur, urad, and Masur removed:-

For enhancing domestic production of pulses, the Government has removed the procurement ceilings of 40 percent for tur, urad, and Masur under Price Support Scheme PSS operations for 2023-24. The government imposed stock limits on tur and urad by invoking the Essential Commodities Act, 1955 in order to prevent hoarding and unscrupulous speculation. The Department has also asked Central Warehousing Corporation and State Warehousing Corporations to provide the details pertaining to tur and urad held in their warehouses.
