#### **National Legal Services Day: 09 November:-**

Every year on November 9th, the National Legal Services Day (NLSD) is observed to raise awareness about the importance of ensuring reasonable, fair, and just procedures for all citizens. The Supreme Court of India established NLSD in 1995 to assist and support the poor and weaker sections of society. It is observed to educate citizens about the various provisions of the Legal Services Authorities Act and the rights of litigants. Each jurisdiction organises legal aid camps, Lok adalats, and legal aid programmes on this day.

Ela Bhatt, the founder of the Self Employed Women's Association (SEWA) and a Padma Bhushan recipient, has died. She was 89 years old. ### **Assam's eminent artist Neel Pawan Baruah passes away:-**

At the age of 86, celebrated artist Neel Pawan Baruah died in Gauhati Medical College & Hospital in Assam. In 1971, the well-known painter and illustrator established the Assam Fine Arts & Craft Society in Guwahati to revive the art of Brindabanivastra, the famous textile painting associated with MahapurushSrimantaSankardev. Born on June 1, 1936, in Tamulisinga village near Teok in Jorhat district, he is well-known for his use of unusual mediums in his paintings. The Government of Assam honoured him with the 'Assam Sourabh' award in 2021.

### **India To Hold Mega 'YudhAbhyas' Military Drill With US Near China Border:-**

India is preparing for a major battalion-level land exercise with the United States, which will take place in Uttarakhand's

Auli from November 15 to December 2, just 100 kilometres from the Line of Actual Control (LAC) with China. The annual India-US bilateral army exercise 'YudhAbhyas' will include a number of complex drills. The last exercise was held in Alaska, United States, in October 2021. The massive India-US YudhAbhyas exercise, which was originally scheduled for the last two weeks of October, has been pushed back to November-December 2022.

## DAILY UPDATE 5 :APPOINTMENT



### Spiritual Leader Mata Amritanandamayi Appointed As Chair Of C20:-

The Government of India has appointed Mata Amritanandamayi Devi (also known as Amma) to chair the country's Civil 20 (C20), a Group of 20 (G20) official engagement group. The G20 is the world's premier intergovernmental forum for developed and emerging economies to address global financial stability. The C20 serves as a platform for civil-society organisations (CSOs) to present non-government and non-business perspectives to G20 leaders. India will hold the G20 presidency for one year, from December 1, 2022 to November 30, 2023.

### India To Contribute \$500,000 For UN Trust Fund For Counter-Terrorism:-

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar announced that India will contribute \$500,000 to the United Nations Trust Fund for Counter-Terrorism this year to help member states with capacity-building in combating terrorism."India will be making a voluntary contribution of half a million dollars to the UN Trust Fund for Counter Terrorism this year to augment the efforts of Office of Counter-Terrorism in providing capacity-building support to member states in preventing and countering the threat of terrorism," the minister said.

### RIL Becomes First Indian Company To Post Earnings Call On Metaverse:-

The proceedings of Reliance Industries Limited's (RIL) second quarter earnings call have been posted on the metaverse. With the announcement, Reliance became the first Indian company to use the medium to engage with its stakeholders. The metaverse earnings call, which can be accessed from any device (including a smartphone), was created in collaboration with GMetri, a no-code metaverse creation platform, according to a report. ## **RBI Revokes Authorisation Certificate Of Chennai-Based GI Technology:-**

The Reserve Bank said it has revoked certificate of authorisation of Chennai-based GI Technology Private Limited over governance concerns in the company. The firm is in the business of issuing and operating prepaid payment instruments. The central bank cited "Governance concerns and non-compliance with regulatory requirements" as the reasons for revoking the Certificate of Authorisation (CoA). Following the revocation of the CoA, it stated that GI Technology will be unable to conduct business in the issuance and operation of prepaid payment instruments.

## **Akanksha Vyavahare Creates Three New National Records At Khelo India Weightlifting Meet:-**

Maharashtra-based weightlifter Akanksha Vyavahare created three new national records in the 40kg weight category at the Khelo India National Ranking Women's Weightlifting tournament at Ghaziabad. The weightlifter, who was also a part of the Target Olympic Podium Scheme, created records in Snatch, Clean and Jerk, and Total. Akanksha bettered her existing Snatch national record, by lifting 60kg. She recorded 71kg in the Clean & Jerk, and on the process, registering a total lift of 131kg.

### **Indian Navy Participates In Maiden Trilateral Exercise With Mozambique And Tanzania:-**

The first edition of the India-Mozambique-Tanzania Trilateral Exercise (IMT TRILAT), a joint maritime exercise involving the navies of India, Mozambique, and Tanzania, has recently begun in Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania. The Indian Navy sent the guided missile frigate INS Tarkash, a Chetak helicopter, and MARCOS (Special Forces). The exercise had three broad goals: developing capability to address common threats through training and sharing best practises, improving interoperability, and strengthening maritime cooperation.
